#### LAA Report April 2015 Karen Hildebrandt

The LAA Board continued to focus on initiatives that were identified by the Membership Survey in 2012 and that supported our mandate including: continuing education, advocacy, and member engagement. The Board conducted an advocacy survey in September to determine where members felt that LAA should focus its advocacy efforts. Several workshops were offered in partnership with Greater Edmonton Library Association (GELA) and the Alberta Association of Library Technicians (AALT). Board members worked very hard to move us forward in these areas, particularly through the work of our committees. There was excellent work done by all our committees including, Member Services, Advocacy, and Continuing Education. Thank you to the LAA members who participated in the advocacy survey as your responses provided us with valuable information to help us set our advocacy efforts for this year.

LAA's social media presence has continued to grow this past year with all members of the Board actively contributing to our website and to our Facebook and Twitter postings.

LAA continues its strong involvement on a national level with The Partnership, Canada's network of provincial and territorial associations. In June 2013, The Partnership launched the Continuing Education Certificate Program (CEC). LAA was instrumental in the development of this project, with Diane Clarke and Sandra Campbell leading the pilot project in 2010 and Christine Sheppard and Lisa Hardy participating on the National Steering Committee in 2013-14. The CEC, administrated by LAA, continues to grow and an institutional pricing model was piloted this past year. The pilot was very successful and plans are underway to offer to this option to library institutions across Canada. LAA's participation in The Partnership also brings members other services such as the Job Board and the Education Institute. Any participation of LAA members in these activities and services gives them discounted pricing and brings additional revenue for LAA, which goes directly back into services to members. LAA's Continuing Education Committee, chaired by Norene James, has represented LAA on the Education Institute national committee, and has also introduced some group opportunities.

As discussed at last year's AGM, LAA was successful in cancelling its GST account and as of April 1, 2015, is no longer required to collect and remit GST. We are taking the necessary steps to remove GST on our website.

LAA's largest continuing education effort is of course the Alberta Library Conference, presented in partnership with ALTA. The ALC Planning Committee has been working hard and it looks to be once again another engaging and informative conference. One of our highlights this year is the evening special event "Two Mayors, One Voice". Registered conference attendees are encouraged to spend an hour with Calgary Mayor Naheed Nenshi and Edmonton Mayor Don Iveson as they discuss how libraries "cannot live on love alone" and why they strongly believe in and advocate on behalf of their library systems.

ALTA's President Laura Ross-Giroux and I have met on several occasions over the past year as well as had many email conversations to ensure that continued communication between our two associations continues and grows. LAA has also connected with The Alberta Library and we hope to continue the conversations to build better collaborative opportunities for the betterment of the library community in Alberta.

Executive Director Christine Sheppard and I were invited to the Future of CLA Summit held on January 31, 2015. Representatives from the Provincial and Territories Library Associations as well as CARL, CULC,

Canadian Health Libraries Association, Canadian Archivists as well as CLA Executive Council were in attendance. After a full morning of discussion the decision was made to form a working group of 10-12 representatives to investigate possible options including a federated library association that would be responsible for National Advocacy and Research efforts. 1<sup>st</sup> VP/President Elect, Jason Openo, is the LAA representative on this very important working group.

A recent opportunity has come to LAA to give a presentation on libraries to the Safe and Healthy Communities Committee of the Alberta Urban Municipalities Association. Although libraries fall under their mandate for policy making etc. this is the first time that they've had a presentation on libraries. It's a great opportunity to make the connection and hopefully open the doors to any future collaboration around advocacy for libraries.

It has been honour to serve as LAA President 2014-2015. It's been a very busy year and I am so appreciative of the amazing Board members that I was privileged to work with this year. I would like to especially acknowledge Christine Sheppard, who in addition to capably managing the business of the Association, has kept us on track. She truly been a pleasure to work with and has been an enormous support to not only the Board but also to me as President.
