“Learning from experience that takes place outside formally structured, institutionally sponsored, classroom-based activities” (Watkins & Marsick, 1992, p. 288)

- Characteristics:
  - Learning occurs holistically across multiple environments
  - Learning is informal and accessible
  - Learning happens in a non-threatening setting
